Additional Clinics at HHMC

We now offer services beyond NHS requirements. Early bird clinics start at 0730 on Mondays and Tuesdays. Minor surgery for lumps and bumps is by referral to in-house surgeon Dr Amir Mansoor. Drs Sekhon & Staples fit and remove coils and implants, and with Dr Lees, offer a full range of joint injections.



Richmond Wellbeing Service

The RWS Psychology services will be moving from its base at Richmond Royal Hospital (now sold to developers) to St John's Health Centre in Twickenham. This means counseling and therapy services will be closer to the surgery and direct referrals can still be made by telephoning 020 8548 5550. They also see patients in our premises.

Changes to Prescriptions

The Richmond Clinical Commissioning Group conducted extensive consultation and met in public on 18th July to decide how best to manage the healthcare budget locally. As a result, Richmond CCG no longer supports NHS prescriptions for gluten free foods, low dose vitamin D and all other medicines available to buy over the counter.



Whooping Cough and Mumps

We strongly advise all pregnant women to see us for the flu and whooping cough vaccines as these illnesses can be devastating in pregnancy and newborns. We are seeing cases of mumps again and together with last year's outbreak of measles, we would recommend that all children and women ensure they've had the MMR.
